The County received 40 proposals at over 7 million dollars for the Vegetation Management Program; recommendations will go to the Board 4/19. Vegetation Management Program has received performance reports on 19 projects approved in 2021 and all projects are in compliance.

Ag + Open Space hosted a well-attended cordage demonstration on Dogbane Preserve on 2/12.

The State of California has a 30 by 2030 objective – 30% of the state conserved by 2030. Ag + Open Space has shared feedback on how to make that happen, how the Bay Area can work towards that goal, and in support of the current budget allocation of \$350 million to the State Coastal Conservancy.

Staff is working with the family owners of El Recreo on their story hopefully will see press released soon regarding the conservation easement

Staff is giving stories to Press Democrat regarding how Ag + Open Space's work impacts climate change and resiliency
