DRAFT LETTER TO BOARD OF SUPERVISORS FROM CITIZENS ADVISORY COMMITTEE (letterhead)

RE: Use of PG&E Settlement Funds Chair Gorin and members of the Board of Supervisors:

The Citizens Advisory Committee is proud of all that Sonoma County Ag + Open Space, a taxpayer-funded special district, has accomplished over the years to permanently protect the unique and special lands in Sonoma County, for agriculture, natural resource, scenic and open space, and recreational value. These lands are our legacy to future generations, and their permanent protection is foundational to enhancing our region's resiliency to climate change. We understand your Board is closing in on a decision in terms of the use of PG&E settlement funds. Ag + Open Space incurred damages to fee land and conservation easement interests from the 2017 fires, and the PG&E settlement recognized and is based in part on those damages. Ag + Open Space is a unique public entity that can deliver services to both public agencies and private landowners across the entire county. We see three main areas where Ag + Open Space could be extremely effective in the strategic use of PG&E settlement funding to facilitate vegetation management and increased resiliency across private and public lands across Sonoma County.

First, focus and expand our land conservation work to permanently protect strategic properties within identified fire prone areas, using available planning, data analysis, and partnerships, where land protection actions would have the greatest strategic impact. This effort would build upon and implement existing and pending Community Wildfire Protection Plans and other resources developed and in process by other County agencies and departments, as well as other partnering fire safety, academic, federal, state, and local government, non-governmental organizations. Ag + Open Space is experienced in negotiating and closing conservation easement acquisitions, and in responsibly stewarding those easements in perpetuity. Easement terms could be negotiated that require landowner adherence to fuels reduction best management practices as articulated by fire agencies, Natural Resource Conservation Service, and local Resource Conservation Districts. Making protected lands available for carbon sequestration and other innovative mitigation initiatives would bring Sonoma County closer to 'carbon zero'.

Third, use PG&E settlement funds to establish and maintain fuel breaks as part of a strategic, regional approach to protect our communities. This work would occur at key anchor Ag + Open Space owned and managed properties, as well as across multiple neighboring properties under various ownerships. Ag + Open Space has a track record of successfully working with various agencies, contractors, community-based organizations and volunteers to accomplish land management work to reduce fuel loading and to enhance ecological health of the properties that we own and manage. Working cooperatively with neighboring landowners to create and maintain a regional, multi parcel shaded fuel break, in partnership with Calfire and others, would expand the reach of the settlement funding to help meet the common purpose of protecting our communities from wildfire events.

Ag + Open Space has the proven capability to leverage PG&E settlement funds, along with the current and proposed community fire safety planning and vegetation planning efforts proposed by Calfire and local fire agencies, Permit Sonoma, Sonoma Water, UC Cooperative Extension, Sonoma and Goldridge Resource Conservation Districts, Rebuild Northbay, and many others, to protect the lands most critical for increasing resilience to climate change and future extreme events in Sonoma County.

In closing, we believe the District can serve you and the citizens of Sonoma County by using its share of these funds for pre-disaster actions that will benefit the common good. In recognition of the urgency of this issue, and with Board direction, Ag + Open Space can immediately pivot existing staff towards the above-described work, until the Board authorizes additional staff resources to support this work on a longer-term basis.
