- <u>Cresta Ranch</u> Staff discovered a cannabis grow in a remote area on the property. The District and Regional Parks is applying for grant funding to provide a portion of the cost of the clean-up. The clean-up is expected to occur this spring or summer.
- <u>Howlett Forest Conservation Easement</u> The purchase was approved by the Board of Directors on February 21, 2017. The conservation easement is over a 1,380-acre property with significant stands of old growth redwood and Douglas fir, and over 5 miles of streams that are within the Gualala River Watershed.
- <u>The Vital Lands Initiative</u> Community Meetings will be held throughout the County from 6:00 pm 8:00 pm on the following dates, at the following locations:
